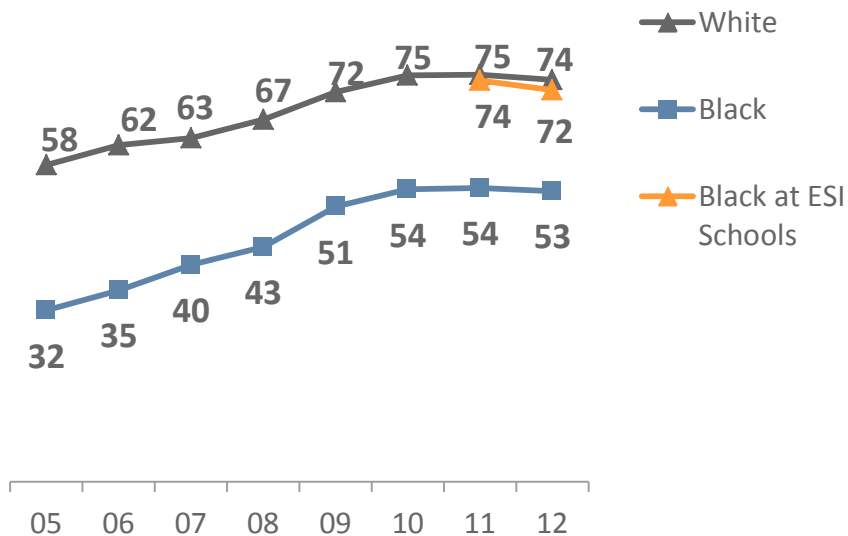

ESI SCHOOLS HAVE NEARLY CLOSED THE GRADUATION GAP AMONG BLACK AND LATINO YOUNG MEN

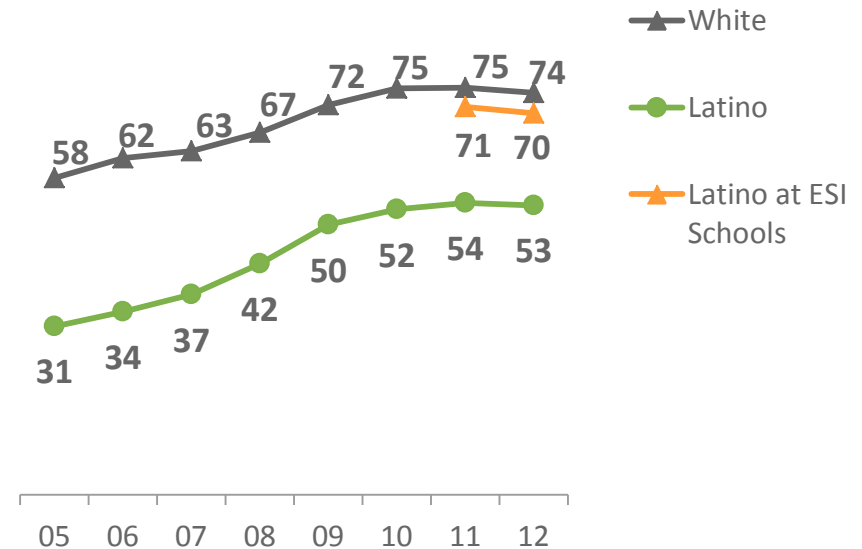
Closing the Black-White Male Graduation Rate Gap

Reduced Gap by 6.3 points (or 23.6%)
from June 2005 – August 2012



Closing the Latino-White Male Graduation Rate Gap

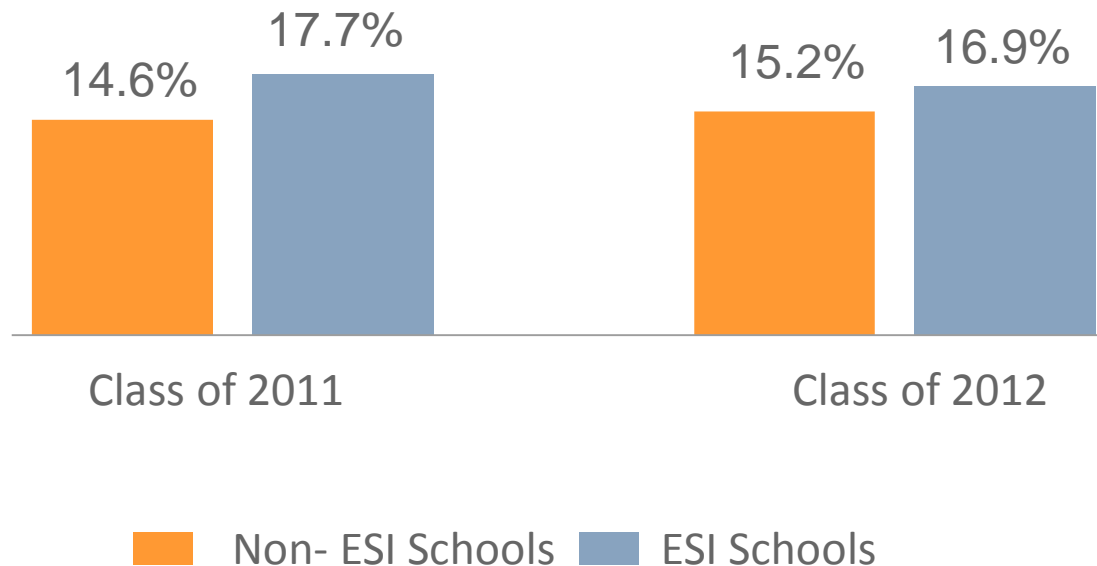
Reduced Gap by 6.6 points (or 24.3%)
from June 2005 – August 2012

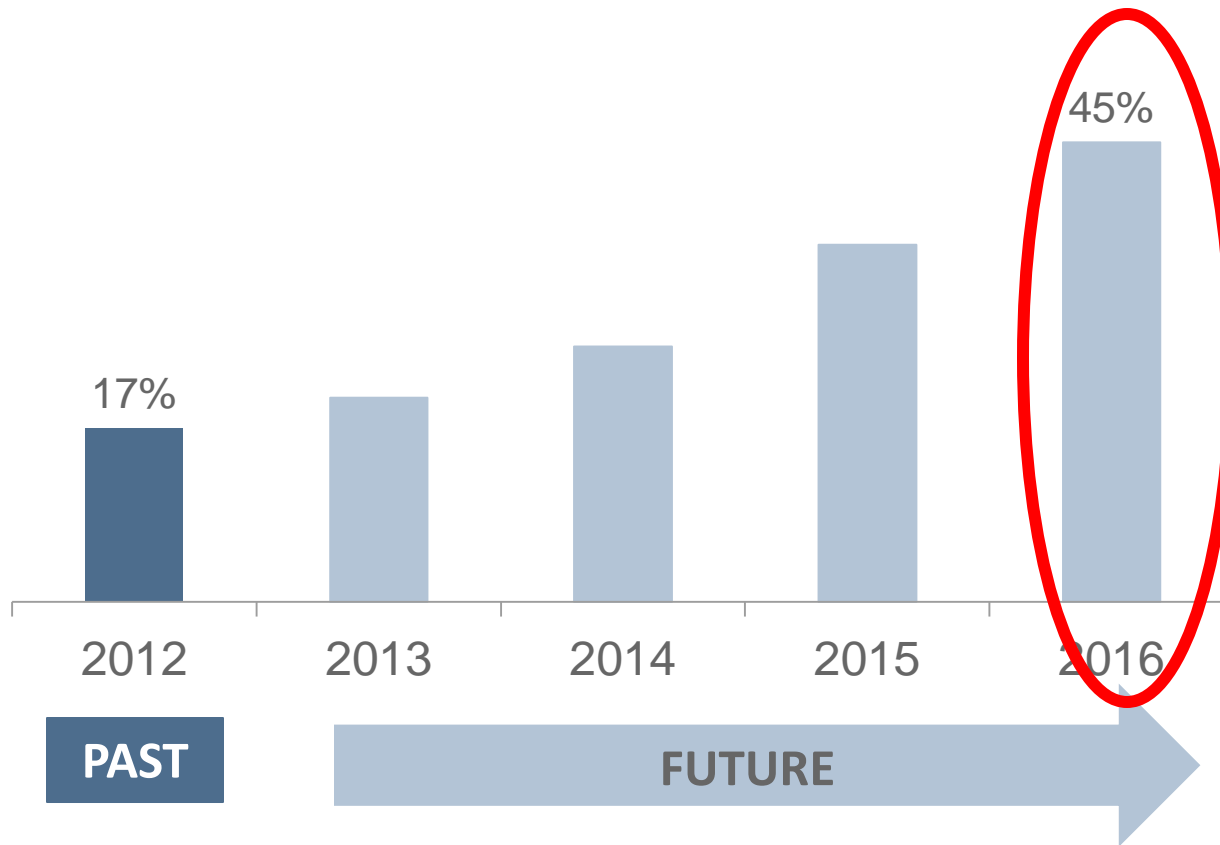
COLLEGE READINESS RATES FOR BLACK AND LATINO YOUNG MEN

ESI's goal is to increase the percentage of Black & Latino young men graduating college and career ready at our 40 schools from 17% in 2012 to 45% in 2016.

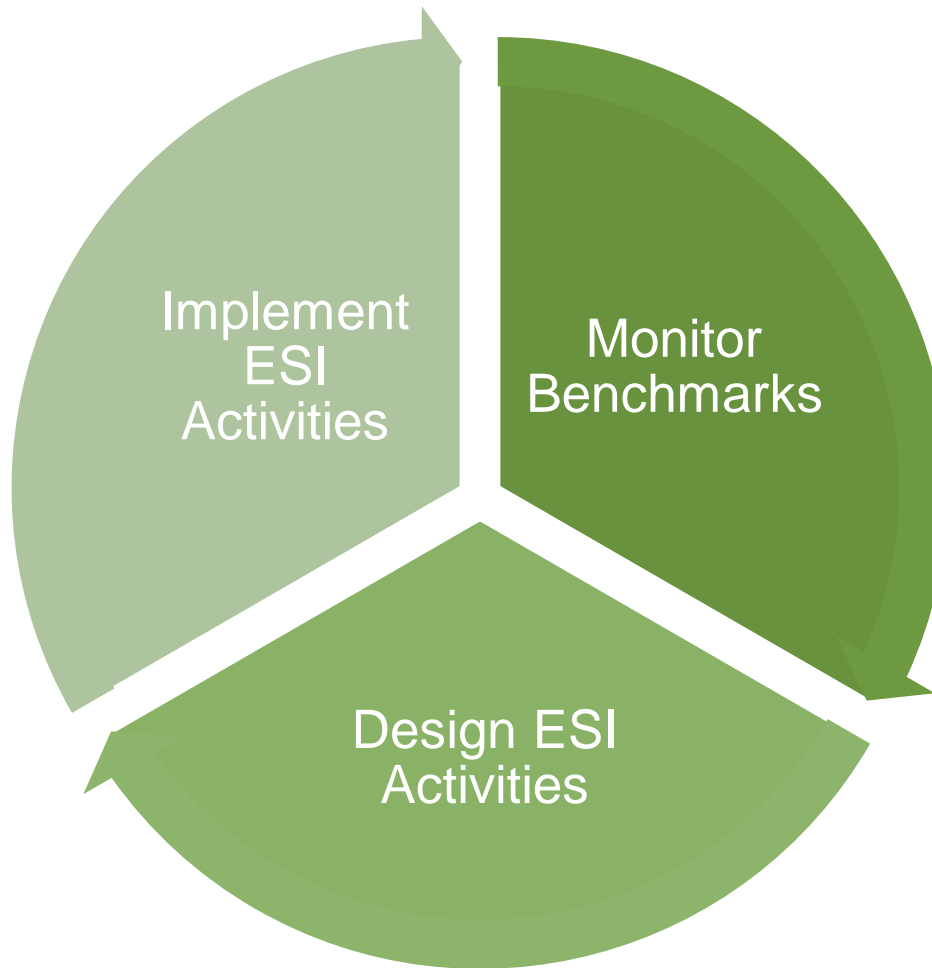

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SCHOOL-LEVEL PROCESS METRICS

In order to support ESI implementation across schools, we examined how schools' individual outcomes on benchmarks changed over time. The chart below illustrates the change in percent of students achieving each of the freshman benchmarks from the 2011-12 school year to the 2012-13 school year. The dark blue represents a greater than 10% improvement over school year 2011-12, while the pale blue represents a greater than 10% decline.

Examining Change from the 2011-12 to 2012-13 School Year

Dark Blue = Greater than 10% Improvement over the Year Before

Gray = Greater than 10% Decline over the Year Before
